Connecticut Core Standards Website

This website (<u>www.ctcorestandards.org</u>) is devoted to providing Connecticut educators, families, and community members with valuable and accurate information as well as concrete supports, such as:

- model units and lessons and standards-aligned classroom materials;
- parent-, student-, and community-friendly materials; and
- resources for professional development and learning.

English Learners

The CSDE English learners webpage (www.ct.gov/sde/EnglishLearners) is continuously updated to provide resources, guidance documents, professional learning modules, and tools for districts and families. In the coming weeks, the Home Language Survey, the Home Language Survey Administration Script, and the Sample Exit Letter will be posted in the top six languages spoken in Connecticut. Mathematics: Instructional Materials Evaluation Toolkit

The CSDE hosted Instructional Materials Evaluation Toolkit (IMET) training at each regional educational service center (RESC) in 2017. This half-day training was designed to give a high-level overview of a tool for evaluating a comprehensive textbook or textbook series for alignment to the shifts and major features of the Connecticut Core Standards (CCS). IMET can be used to inform decisions about purchasing, evaluate previously purchased materials to identify necessary modification, and build understanding of what aligned materials look like.
